As Egypt and Saudi Arabia press ahead with their goals of developing nuclear weapons programmes, concern over Iran's nuclear development continues to mount. It seems the European Union has given

"The problems with Iran will not be resolved through economic sanctions
alone."

This will no doubt be bad news for Israel, who was relying on efforts by
the European Union and the international community, to prevent Iran from
obtaining the technology to build a nuclear weapon. It is believed that if
Iran ever developed a nuclear weapon, the first target of choice for
President Ahmadinejad would be Tel-Aviv. US President Bush
has downplayed
the idea of a US strike against Iran, stating
that there is still a chance
to resolve the crisis through
diplomacy.

Quote: ""The Iranian people are good, honest, decent
people and they've got a government that is belligerent, loud, noisy,
threatening - a government which is in defiance of the rest of the world and
says `We want a nuclear weapon,"' Bush said. "So our
objective is to keep the pressure so rational folks will show up

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and say it's not worth

the isolation."

II interceptor missile at the day

night for the first time on Sunday. The test occurred
